

Session 2 focuses on the hypothesis test methodology. What are the research tools for knowledge production and scientific enquiries that lead to new theoretical viewpoints? How do researchers articulate and justify their arguments? How does research become relevant for the discipline and for the scientific community? What is the relationship between research and the imperative to find its application in the real world? A series of short PhD presentations and discussions will contribute to the understanding of the key elements of scientific research, such as the theoretical framework and position, research methods and goals. The seminar aims to open a debate considering interactions with other disciplines like history, philosophy, and others, and to explore the relationship between theory and practical work in their manifold possible overlapping.

10:00 – 11:00 Session 3: Digital Data: The New Urban Infrastructures

Curators and Chairs: Ognen Marina and Mitesh Dixit

In Session 3, researchers will examine how 'Big Data' has become essential for urban research, planning, development, policy making, and governance. The discussion will investigate the concept of 'Infrapolitics', which understands hard and soft infrastructure not as distinct elements but as integrated components in developing the built and unbuilt environment. Participants will look at the use of data, not as information, but as a 'new' infrastructure that is critical in influencing both space and place, i.e., morphologies of cities. Finally, the participants will discuss varying and sometimes conflicting approaches to collecting, organizing, and employing data as information, as a research methodology in the processes of examining cities, territories, and their operational landscapes.
